## Leadership Report

### National Reconciliation Week Grounded in truth. Walk together with courage.

National Reconciliation Week is a time for all students to learn about cultures, histories, achievements and to explore how all of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation. The dates remain the same each year from the 27th of May to the 3rd of June. These dates signify two important milestones in Australia's reconciliation journey, these being the 1967 referendum and the High Court Mabo decision. Students at Wandana participated in deep and rich learning about the importance of reconciliation and what steps they could take to move forward to create respectful relationships with the wider community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Good judgement and decision making skills develop from experience and reflection. In Room 14 the students have been discussing topics e.g. "everyone needs to eat breakfast".

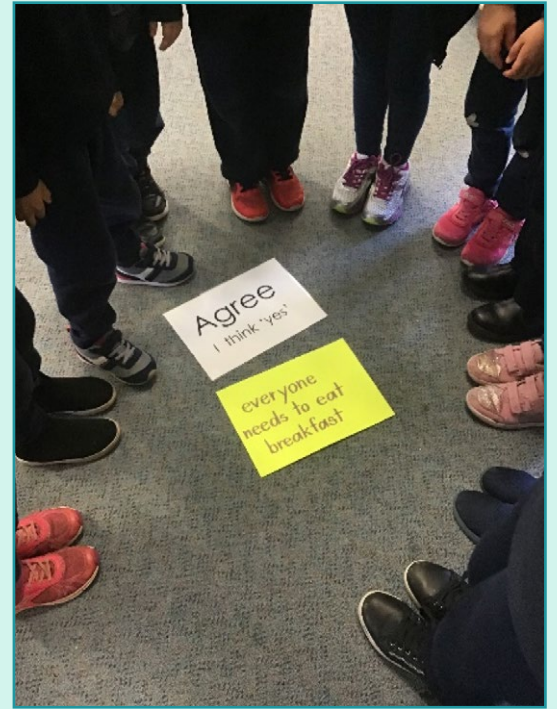
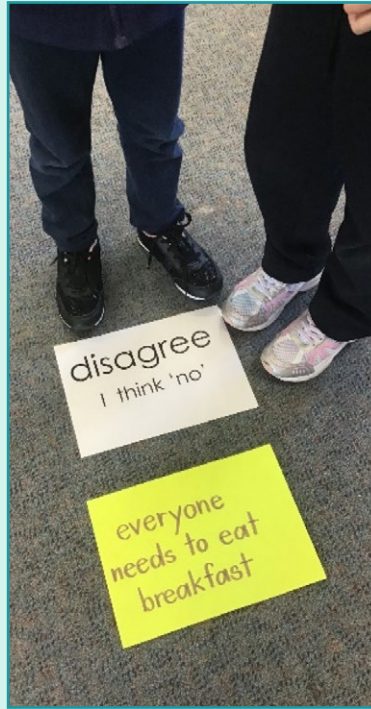
The students were asked to consider and make a choice - whether they agreed or disagreed - based on their experience and understanding.
