Reconciliation Week

Reconciliation Week is celebrated around our country between May 27 and June 3. It coincides with two significant dates in Australia's history both of which provide strong symbols of our hopes and aims for reconciliation. The theme this year for Reconciliation week is **Don't Keep History A Mystery.**



WEEK4

May 27 marks the anniversary of 1967 Referendum in which more than 90% of Australians voted to remove clauses from the Australian Constitution which discriminated against Indigenous Australians and granted them Australian Citizenship.

June 3 marks the anniversary of the High Court of Australia's judgement in 1992 on the Mabo case. This Decision recognised Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the original inhabitants of this continent and validated their legal right to Traditional Land. Reconciliation lives in the hearts, minds and actions of us all as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non-Indigenous peoples. As a school community with families from a range of backgrounds, this is something we must focus on.

Wandana school is celebrating Reconciliation week by having a whole school Assembly next Friday. Each class will be presenting work and activities that they have been doing during the week.

Before the assembly, we will assemble in class groups in front of the flags. Aunty Judy will talk about the Flag Ceremony. A student will read the Kaurna welcome and the two others will raise the flags. Everyone will then move into the gym for the start of assembly. Families are welcome to attend.
