Reading Room

Our new Reading Room furniture has now arrived and we are very excited to open this space up to families and students at 8.10am each morning. We will have a staff member who will be available to bring the joy of reading to the children every day. We also encourage families to come in during this time and also read with their children. We hope to see you there and that you are able to enjoy a story with your child as well.

Reading books each day is extremely important to children and their success. Did you know that if a child reads 20 minutes each day, they will read approximately 1,800,000 words per year and can score in the 90th percentile on standardised tests. Students who read only 5 minutes a day only read 282,000 words each year and if a student only reads for one minute per day will read only 8,000 words per year!

We look forward to seeing you in Block 2 (Room 10) each morning.
