Setting the Scene for 2021

During the Pupil Free Day on the 2nd of November, teachers and SSOs were busy looking at school data and planning for 2021. It was fantastic to see staff connect and have scheduled time for deep and meaningful conversations about student learning. The data story is still telling us that writing and numeracy will be our continued focus, with staff looking at specific areas of curriculum content and the "how" they will teach it. Current research on effective teaching strategies will be the building blocks for next year. Some huge positives from the year is the continued use of Brightpath, a teacher tool used to help support student writing and teachers having the opportunity to work in professional learning teams.
