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Ngarrindjeri Excursion



Aboriginal students from Year 5, 6 and 7 travelled to Encounter Bay with Luke and Aunty Judy to explore the Ngarrindjeri Country they had been learning about in their language sessions. We talked about the Ngurunderi Dreaming and were interested and excited to visit the places from the Dreaming.

Monday included a rest stop at Mt Compass and the boys made boats with Aunty Judy from the leaves of the rushes growing in the nearby wetland environment. We visited the Urimbirra Wildlife Park and were lucky enough to see lots of animals. The highlight was patting the koalas and the kangaroos. We also saw an ancient canoe tree and learned about life on the river for the Ngarrindjeri people. We drove to The Bluff and enjoyed the scenery and a hike.

Tuesday was spent exploring Granite Island – which is a short walk across from Victor Harbor. The kids loved looking among the rocks for small ocean wildlife and were alarmed at the noises of the lizards rustling around off the track. After this we cooled off with a swim at Bashams Beach in Pt Elliot. The view from Freeman Knob out to the Southern Ocean was amazing.

Wednesday was spent packing and cleaning up as well as a quick swim before leaving for home. We all learnt so much but most importantly we had fun!


Some Ngarrindjeri words:
